Pre-Surgery Certification Checklist



Prior to performing surgery independently, all surgeons need to be observed by OLAC vet staff to confirm proficiency of surgical skills.

Review the specific Surgical Procedure as described in your lab's ACUC-approved AUP (in eProtocol), including Anesthetics and Analgesics.
If procedure includes the use of controlled substances, obtain authorization via EH&S to be
added your lab's CSAU list: EHS/how-do-i-get-authorization-use-controlled-substances-my-research
If you do not have the described anesthetics/analgesics on hand, submit a Pharmacy Purchase
